Borges, of Irell & Manella LLP, and 12 finding that that there is good cause for the Department and Mr. Chisick to fully and finally settle, compromise 13 and resolve Mr. Chisick's financial obligations under the Department's Entry of Findings of Fact and Conclusions 14 of Law and Final Order, entered January 27, 2003 ("Final Order"), hereby agree to the entry of this Agreed Order 15 Concerning Respondent Jamie Chisick's Financial Obligations Under Final Order ("Agreed Order"). This Agreed Order is entered pursuant to RCW 34.05.060 of the Administrative Procedure Act based on the following: 16 17 AGREEMENT AND ORDER 1. 18 Final Order Shall Remain Effective. The Department and Mr. Chisick have agreed to fully and 19 finally settle, compromise and resolve Mr. Chisick's financial obligations under the Department's Entry of 20 Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law and Final Order, entered January 27, 2003, in Cause No. 97-083 ("Final Order"). A copy of the Final Order is attached hereto as Exhibit A. Except for the financial obligations of Mr. 21 Chisick under the Final Order, which are fully and finally settled, compromised and resolved by virtue of this 22 23 24 On June 20, 2006, Division II of the Washington State Court of Appeals issued a partially published decision affirming the Final Order in its entirety. See Nationscapital Mortgage Corp. v. Dep't of Financial Institutions, 133 Wn. App. 723, 25 137 P.3d 78 (2006).

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Agreed Order, all provisions of the Final Order shall remain effective against Mr. Chisick and other Respondents, as the case may be, as set forth in the Final Order.

- 2. Mr. Chisick's Financial Condition. Mr. Chisick has represented that he currently has an inability to pay the financial obligations imposed upon him by the Final Order. Mr. Chisick provided the Department with a written statement made under oath comprehensively describing his finances and financial situation (hereinafter "Financial Affidavit") prior to the entry of this Agreed Order.
- 3. Fines Against Mr. Chisick. Under the provisions of the Final Order, Mr. Chisick currently owes the Department \$292,800.00 in fines. Subject to and upon Mr. Chisick's compliance with and completion of the obligations (including, without limitation, the payment obligation) set forth in paragraph 4 below, the Department agrees that Mr. Chisick will be released of and will not be obligated to pay the \$292,800.00 in fines imposed under the Final Order.
 - 4. Payment of Partial Restitution. Paragraph 5 on page 23 of the Final Order provides:

Nations and Jamie Chisick, jointly and severally, shall pay restitution in the amount of \$712.527.19 to 120 consumers as set out in Exhibit No. 66-Prater was removed since Nations has already paid restitution to Prater. This restitution shall be paid only once by Nations and/or Jamie Chisick.

In full and final satisfaction and settlement of this \$712,527.19 owed to consumers as restitution under the Final Order, it is agreed that Mr. Chisick shall pay the 120 consumers, as set forth in Exhibit No. 66 [A Hearing Exhibit], a total aggregate restitution amount of \$250,000.00, as set forth herein. A copy of the list of consumers owed restitution, taken from Exhibit No. 66, is attached hereto as Exhibit B. Restitution shall be paid to consumers on a pro-rata basis as set forth in the schedule attached hereto as Exhibit C. It is agreed that prior to the Director's entry of this Agreed Order, Mr. Chisick shall transfer the \$250,000.00 to the account of an independent third party escrow company licensed in the state of Washington (the "Escrow Company") and shall provide the Department with evidence that such money has been transferred to the Escrow Company. Upon entry of this Agreed Order by the Director, Mr. Chisick shall promptly provide the Escrow Company with a copy of this Agreed Order. After transfer to the Escrow Company and upon entry of this Agreed Order, Mr. Chisick shall not

be permitted to receive any portion of the \$250,000.00 transferred to the Escrow Company. Within sixty (60) DEPARTMENT OF FINANCIAL INSTITUTIONS Division of Consumer Services 150 Israel Rd SW

days from entry of this Agreed Order, Mr. Chisick shall cause the Escrow Company to mail the restitution
payments to consumers totaling \$250,000.00, as set forth in Exhibit C. Each mailed restitution check must be
accompanied by the explanatory cover letter discussed in further detail in paragraph 5 of this Agreed Order.
Although mailing of the restitution payments must be completed within sixty (60) days, it is understood by the
parties that the Escrow Company shall promptly begin mailing payments upon entry of this Agreed Order. All
expenses associated with the Escrow Company, including but not limited to the cost of mailings and stop payment
fees, shall be borne by Mr. Chisick. It is further agreed that, within one hundred and twenty (120) days from the
entry of this Agreed Order, Mr. Chisick shall cause the Escrow Company to provide the Department with written
proof of such restitution payments. The "written proof" at a minimum must consist of (i) a declaration from the
Escrow Company that they have mailed the checks in the amounts and to the persons and addresses, along with
the required cover letter described in paragraph 5, as required by this Agreed Order, (ii) copies of the mailed
checks, and (iii) copies of the front and back of cancelled checks to the extent that checks are received and cashed
or negotiated by their payees. If restitution cannot be made to any particular consumer due to lack of a current
address or for any other reason, Mr. Chisick shall cause the Escrow Company to take the necessary steps to
escheat such funds to the State of Washington Department of Revenue as unclaimed property and provide the
Department with written proof of such action. If restitution payments are mailed and not returned, and if the
checks are uncashed or not negotiated for more than one hundred twenty (120) days from the date of mailing, Mr.
Chisick shall cause the Escrow Company to place a stop payment on those checks and escheat the funds to the
State of Washington Department of Revenue in the name of the payee. All restitution payments or payments to
escheat funds as unclaimed property must be completed within one hundred eighty (180) days from the entry of
this Agreed Order. Within fifteen (15) days of receipt of written proof of full compliance with the restitution
obligation of this paragraph, the Department agrees to provide to Mr. Chisick, in a writing signed by an authorized
representative of the Department, acknowledgement of satisfaction of the financial obligations of this Agreed
Order. It is further agreed that, within one hundred and ninety-five (195) days from the entry of this Agreed
Order, Mr. Chisick shall cause the Escrow Company to provide the Department with written proof of all

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restitution payments and payments to escheat funds, for which written proof has not already been provided to the 1 2 Department. 5. Explanatory Message. It is agreed that Mr. Chisick shall ensure that the Escrow Company 3 encloses, along with each restitution check, an explanatory message from the Department concerning the 4 restitution payment. A copy of the explanatory message is attached hereto as Exhibit D. 5 6 6. Failure To Make Restitution Payments as Required. It is agreed that in the event that Mr. Chisick fails to make restitution or fails to escheat such restitution amounts as unclaimed property as set forth in 7 8 paragraph 4 above, then in the event of such breach, Mr. Chisick agrees to pay all sums due under the Final Order, including the entire \$292,800.00 in fines and the entire \$712, 527.19 in restitution imposed under the Final Order. 7. Rights of Consumers. It is agreed that this Agreed Order shall not release, waive, or in any way 10 11 affect any legal rights that any consumers may have concerning Mr. Chisick. The Department does not represent 12 or have the consent of consumers to take any action concerning their personal legal rights. 8. 13 Authority of the Department. It is agreed that nothing in this Agreed Order shall be construed 14 as preventing the Department from fully exercising its authority and enforcing any provision of chapter 19.146 15 Revised Code of Washington and Title 208 of the Washington Administrative Code. 16 9. Voluntarily Entered.
